Pastor's Column

My dear parishioners,

Corona virus or COVID19 is the ongoing concern or conversation piece these days. People are calling parish office with questions and suggestions. I am grateful for your thoughtfulness and care. Rest assured, our Archdiocese is in close contact with health authorities and giving us timely updates. This week's bulletin includes the guidelines published by the Archdiocese. I am also copying the response from the archdiocese regarding the question of distributing communion on tongue.

"Good evening Fr. Cherickal,

As for communion on the tongue – yes, we're aware of questions around that but at this point we have not been directed by public health to suspend the practice. They're trying to strike the balance between prudence and not causing panic. We are not yet at "heightened" levels of pre-emptive measures that we were for SARS some years ago. In fact, the health officer today was telling me that we are not anywhere close to that. The challenge is our parishioners are watching/reading reports from parts of the world that are at far higher levels of infection than we are locally.

Be assured that we're monitoring things daily and won't hesitate to make additional changes if directed to do so. I know some parishes are letting parishioners know at the beginning of Mass that, while we have not been directed by the archdiocese to do so, they may wish to receive communion in the hand to minimize the potential spread of germs, that sort of thing."

It is important that we take proactive measures. As people of God let us turn to the Lord as well. May I suggest that you may use the following prayer for your personal use and pray Psalm 91.

Lord God, we entrust to you, the people affected by Corona virus:

the countries, the families and communities.

We pray especially for the health care workers, our leaders of nations,

that you guide and protect them. We pray that your Spirit inspire those researching and seeking for drugs, medicines and health care systems

Lord Jesus, Who stills the storm and soothes the frantic hearts,
we come to you in this time of uncertainty and fear.
We lift our prayer to you Lord, and trust in your infinite mercy,
as we wait for your healing presence among us. Amen.

Wednesday 19




The soldiers whipped Jesus many times.

Coronavirus (COVID-19) Preventive Measures

The Archdiocese of Toronto continues to work with health officials to monitor the local situation regarding active cases of the coronavirus (COVID-19). At this time, Cardinal Collins has asked all parishes to implement the following measures:

- At the Sign of Peace, refrain from shaking hands a simple bow, nod or "Peace be with you" to your neighbour is appropriate.
- For parishes offering communion under both species, forgo the distribution of the Precious Blood from the chalice for the congregation at this time.
- Parishes should ensure that those distributing communion wash their hands or use hand sanitizer before and after the distribution of communion.

Please also continue to practice healthy hygiene – wash your hands with soap or use hand sanitizer regularly, remain home if you are sick, sneeze/cough into your sleeve and avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth. Let us continue to care for ourselves and one another as we pray for all those impacted worldwide by COVID-19.
